Helmsley Charitable Trust grants \$88,179 to help Sakakawea Medical Center purchase state-of-the-art ultrasound equipment

The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust has granted \$88,179 to Sakakawea Medical Center to purchase a new Verathon Bladder Scanner and MindRay TE X Plus POCUS (Point of Care Ultrasound) Machine as part of a \$27.4 million ultrasound initiative in North Dakota.

The initiative includes more than \$21.8 million to help 69 North Dakota hospitals and health centers purchase ultrasound imaging devices and nearly \$5.7 million to boost sonography and point of care ultrasound (POCUS) training opportunities across the state.



"Having this new equipment at Sakakawea Medical Center has vastly improved the care we can provide for our patients," said Natalie Yeager, RN, ER Care Coordinator / Infection Preventionist. "With this new equipment, we have been able to increase our standardization and efficiency of clinical workflows, thus improving patient outcomes."

Ultrasound uses high-frequency sound waves to produce images of structures inside the body. This safe, cost-effective tool supports other clinical information to help providers make timely diagnoses and provide appropriate treatment.

The Helmsley Charitable Trust has committed a total of \$72 million to fund ultrasound equipment and training initiatives for rural communities and underserved populations in Nevada, North Dakota, Minnesota, and Wyoming.





Accelerated Resolution Therapy

Keep the knowledge, lose the pain.

What is Accelerated Resolution Therapy (ART)?

Accelerated Resolution Therapy is a new technique offered by Coal Country Community Health Center therapists that helps to restore mental health by changing the way distressing memories and images are stored in the brain. When we recall sad, scary, or confusing memories or situations, we experience uncomfortable emotions and feelings in our bodies. If we can change the images, we eliminate the symptoms.

What can I expect during an ART Session?

During an ART session, your therapist will guide your eyes back and forth using bilateral stimulation to help your brain access and process a memory. You can share as much or as little as you want. Through voluntary image replacement, your brain can 'update' distressing images, making the memory feel less overwhelming. This process, called memory reconsolidation, helps your brain naturally refile the memory in a more comfortable way.
